

Proposed Evaluation of Innovation Projects

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Overview of MHSA Innovation

- The general requirements of Innovative Projects are:
 - Introduce a mental health practice or approach that is new to the overall mental health system, including, but not limited to, prevention and early intervention.

OR

 Make a change to an existing practice in the field of mental health, including but not limited to, application to a different population.

OR

 Apply to the mental health system a promising community-driven practice or approach that has been successful in non-mental health contexts of settings.

OR

• Participate in a housing program designed to stabilize a person's living situation while also providing supportive services on-site.



Overview of MHSA Innovation

- The Primary Purpose of Innovative Projects are to achieve one of the following:
 - Increase access to mental health services to underserved groups, including permanent supportive housing.
 - Increase the quality of mental health services, including measurable outcomes.
 - Promote interagency and community collaboration related to mental health services or supports or outcomes.
 - Increase access to mental health services, including permanent supportive housing.



- Innovative Project Regulations
 - Reporting out of demographics annually
 - Additional information in the Annual progress report, independently or embedded
 - Final outcome report, independently or embedded



- Evaluation results to be included in the:
 - The Annual Innovative Project report:
 - Available data
 - Elements of project contributing to outcomes
 - The Final Innovative Project Report:
 - Description
 - Outcomes (established vs. new)
 - Assessment
 - Explanation



- Other evaluation elements required:
 - County to design the method
 - Evaluation will measure intended mental health outcome selected by County
 - County to select appropriate indicators to measure this intended mental health outcome.
 - Measurement selected needs to related to the Primary Purpose of the County's Innovative Project.



Update:

- Counties continue to submit concept papers and project proposals
- Several new Innovative projects have been approved over the past year by the Commission.
- MHSOAC seeks to develop a robust technical assistance process to support the advancement of more innovative service programs.
 - Expanding involvement of OAC staff with Counties and internally.
- MHSOAC staff are developing a flow chart on how to effectively achieve this TA process.
- Focus is also moving toward building out the evaluation component of Innovation



The Ask....and the Why
