APRIL 2017 MHSOAC COMMISSION MEETING

Sacramento County Office of Education Mather, CA

At the April 27, 2017 meeting, the Mental Health Services Oversight & Accountability Commission took action on the following items:

- The Commission voted to support Senate Bills (SB) 191 and SB 192 (Beall).
 - SB 191—Student Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Services allows a county or a qualified provider and a local educational agency to enter into a partnership to create a program that targets pupils with mental health and substance use disorders. It creates the County and Local Educational Agency Partnership Fund to fund the partnerships.
 - SB 192 (Beall)—Mental Health Services Act Reversion Fund allows for reverted unspent funds to be deposited for allocation by the Legislature to counties to expand capacity for services and supports to address unmet community needs.
- The Commission voted to support Assembly Bill (AB) 254 (Thurmond).
 - AB 254—Local Educational Agency Pilot for Overall Needs requires the Department of Health Care Services, in cooperation with the California Department of Education, to establish the Local Educational Agency Pilot for Overall Needs for to improve mental health outcomes of students through a whole person care approach by providing funding for direct health services.
- The Commission voted to support Assembly Bill (AB) 1315 (Mullin).
 - AB 1315—Early Psychosis Detection and Intervention Competitive Selection Process Act would establish an advisory committee to the MHSOAC for purposes of creating an early psychosis detection and intervention competitive selection process to, among other things, expand the provision of high-quality, evidence-based early psychosis detection and intervention services in California by providing funding to the counties for this purpose..
- The Commission authorized entering into a contract with Alexan RPM to fund additional technical assistance and project management support for business processes and information technology projects.
- The Commission adopted the Fiscal Reversion Report with the recommendation that reverted unspent funds be kept in the same component upon redistribution.
- The Commission approved an Innovative Project Plan for Modoc County.
- The Commission approved an Innovative Project Plan for Kern County.
