



Foundry Youth Mental Health Integrated Care Model

Half of all mental health needs begin by age 14, but many children and youth struggle to access care appropriate for their needs, particularly care that integrates behavioral health care, medical care, substance use intervention, and educational/employment supports.

As counties throughout California expand prevention and early intervention programs, including school-linked services and early psychosis interventions, opportunities remain to close gaps in the continuum of programs and promote links to existing systems of care.

Innovative models, such as the Foundry Program (https://foundrybc.ca/) in British Columbia (similar to the *headspace* program in Australia and Jigsaw in Ireland) can support this critical continuum for 12-25 year olds.

Foundry involves over 100 partnerships across the province of BC. The Foundry central office, hosted by Providence Health Care, leads the provincial initiative and supports the development of local centres. Each Foundry centre is operated by a lead agency that brings together local partners, service providers, young people and caregivers. Foundry's online platform, foundrybc.ca, is powered by BC Children's Hospital.

Foundry representatives also will describe the new international network for youth mental health programs called Frayme (https://www.frayme.ca/) and discuss how programs across California can become involved.

Please join us to meet and learn directly from the Foundry team about their expanding youth mental health service system that is growing throughout British Columbia and now Canada.
