Discussion: UCLA Population Level Outcome Measures Research Study

Summary: In April 2018, the MHSOAC approved a two-year research project with the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), Center for Health Services and Society to execute a plan to identity, gather, maintain, display and disseminate key metrics of the negative consequences of mental health challenges and unmet needs in California.

The key deliverable of this contract will be delivery of a set of measures to enable the MHSOAC to track mental health-related outcomes statewide and by county. MHSOAC and the UCLA Team is working with stakeholders, Behavioral Health Directors, and MHSA Program Coordinators in understanding outcome measures that may already be used in mental health reports such as Mental Health Services Act Three-Year Program & Expenditure Plans and Annual Updates.

MHSOAC Senior Researcher Michelle Adams will be leading a discussion with the following questions:

- 1. What are the most important issues for persons who are unserved and underserved and why are these issues important?
- What are the most important meaningful data visualizations for the public when MHSOAC publishes the Outcome Measures final report?
