- \$8.56M for Personnel
- \$3.83M for Operations
- \$20M for Mental Health Wellness Act
- \$7.6M for BHSSA
- \$6.7M for Community Advocacy
- \$400K for Full Service Partnership
- \$100K for Proposition 1 Implementation

Additional allocations from prior years and upcoming initiatives, such as the \$20M Innovation Partnership Fund, are also included.
