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

Goals


Purpose: To help prioritize areas for funding and approve a planning process for

- \$7.6M in ongoing BHSSA grant funds and
- Additional one-time BHSSA administrative and evaluation funds



BHSSA Components

- Grants: \$280M to foster system change
- Technical Assistance: capacity building around key areas, including sustainability
- Evaluation and Learning









BHSSA Ongoing Appropriation and One-time Funds

Grants

- \$280 across four phases to
 57 county behavioral health departments and their LEA partners.
- In 2027, \$7.6 million in ongoing appropriation to spend on local assistance.

Administrative Funds

- \$25 million in one-time fundssome of which has been earmarked or encumbered.
- Limited Term staffing plan recently approved to support ongoing grant monitoring (4 positions).
- Additional funds need to be encumbered by June 30, 2026.

Evaluation Fund

- \$16.6 million in one-time funds to support evaluation.
- A portion has been encumbered to WestEd.
- Additional funds need to be encumbered by June 30, 2026.
