Advocacy Spotlight: United Parents

Item Goals

• Learn about the advocacy work of United Parents, the Commission's parents and caregivers advocacy grantee. United Parents empowers parents and caregivers to advocate for the needs of their families as well as maintain their own wellness while navigating the challenges that come with caregiving.

Behavioral Health Landscape

- Advocacy contracts exist because of California's unique community planning process
 which requires counties to seek out and support public participation; empowering
 historically underserved communities to participate in this process and share key
 insights ultimately improving behavioral health services and outcomes.
- The Behavioral Health Services Act affirms and expands this process, ensuring community voices are heard locally and reflected in statewide policy and funding decisions.
- Parents and caregivers of children and family members with mental, behavioral, and/or emotional health conditions have long been partners in transforming the behavioral health system.

Relevant Commission Work

 The Commission, as authorized by the State Legislature, oversees funding to community-based organizations to support the behavioral health needs of nine specific underserved populations through advocacy, training and education, and outreach and engagement activities. The Commission awarded United Parents its parents and caregivers advocacy contract in March 2024.
