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## Consent Calendar

### Item Goals

- **Seven items** on the consent calendar are county innovation plans. The Commission has authority to review and authorize county innovation spending through June 2026.
  - **Innovation Plan for San Francisco County: Pacific Islander Innovative Project:** The county proposes to explore and address the behavioral health needs of Pacific Islanders in the context of community violence using a family-centered and culturally informed approach.
  - **Innovation Plan for Del Norte County: Trillium Drop-In Teen Center:** The county proposes to support prevention and early intervention programming by implementing a community-designed model of care that provides a non-clinical space for individuals to access critical and culturally appropriate services and supports aimed at reducing disparities in behavioral health.
  - **Innovation Plan for San Francisco County: Latine/a/o/x and Indigenous Healing-Centered Systems Transformation Project:** The county proposes to assess if a community-defined Indigenous- and Latine-rooted healing framework can be effectively integrated into a public behavioral health system to improve client outcomes, increase cultural responsiveness, and reduce workforce burnout.
  - **Innovation Plan for Santa Clara County: Program Improvements for Valued Outpatient Treatment (PIVOT):** The county proposes to prepare for implementation of Proposition 1, also known as the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA), by joining PIVOT Innovation project that was originally approved by the Commission in November 2024.
  - **Innovation Plan for Tulare County: Full Service Partnership Reboot:** The county proposes to redesign Full-Service Partnership programs and align these services with new Behavioral Health Services Act requirements.

- **Innovation Plan for Tulare County: The Horizon Project:** The county proposes to address the lack of community-based providers trained to provide behavioral health services for individuals with eating disorders.
  - **Innovation Plan for Lake County: Semi-Statewide Enterprise Health Record Innovation Project Phase 2:** The county proposes to partner with the California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA) on Phase 2 of the Semi-Statewide Enterprise Health Record Innovation Project.
- **Three items** on the consent calendar are new or renewal contracts.
    - Program 11: Creative services contract for up to \$135,000 for FY 26-27.
    - Veterans High Risk Security Solutions, Inc.: On-site security contract for \$139,656 for FY 26-27.
    - TIM TIOTE: Competitive procurement consulting for \$300,000 for FY 26-27.

## Behavioral Health Landscape

- Under the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA), counties will no longer be required to create innovation plans, and any Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Innovation funding not encumbered by June 30, 2026, will be converted to BHSA funds.

## Proposed Motion

That the Commission approve the Consent Calendar that includes:

- Innovation Plan for San Francisco County: Latine/a/o/x and Indigenous Healing-Centered Systems Transformation Project, up to \$1,800,000 for three years; and
- Innovation Plan for Santa Clara County: Program Improvements for Valued Outpatient Treatment (PIVOT), up to \$4,100,000 for two years and two months; and
- Innovation Plan for Tulare County: Full Service Partnership Reboot, up to \$2,114,809 for three years; and
- Innovation Plan for Tulare County: The Horizon Project, up to \$251,751 for three years; and

- Innovation Plan for Lake County: Semi-Statewide Enterprise Health Record Innovation Project Phase 2, up to \$82,471.30 for two years; and

- TIM TIOTE: Competitive procurement consulting for \$300,000 for FY 26-27.
