





Charter Purpose and Goals

SHAPE THE COMMISSION'S LEGISLATIVE AGENDA AND ADVANCE PRIORITIES BY:

Monitoring legislation, developing and proposing new policies or amendments for existing laws that enhance behavioral health services and access Engaging with Commission partners, including community leaders, providers, and advocates, to obtain diverse insights and identify policy priorities, and where applicable, adopt policy reports Supporting and collaborating with the Commission's Advocacy Contract Grantees to strengthen their capacity for effective representation and advocacy on behalf of their constituent communities

Background on Advocacy

- The Commission funds community-based organizations to support behavioral health needs of underserved populations
- Contracts are awarded through competitive procurement and are typically awarded for three years of services
- Organizations conduct advocacy, training and education, and outreach and engagement activities and programs to further the voice of the communities they serve

Update on Transition Age Youth Advocacy

The Commission is updating its approach to advocacy through an extensive community engagement process.



Meetings. Staff met with several statewide agencies to learn how they approach TAY engagement



Listening Session. An in-person listening session will be held on June 24th in Sacramento to hear directly from TAY



Survey. A survey will be distributed to gather valuable insight from the TAY population




Virtual Listening Session. An additional listening session will be held in July to capture more TAY voice on advocacy and behavioral health



Update on Immigrant and Refugee RFP

- Current Immigrant and Refugee organizations will complete their 3-year contracts on June 30 and September 30
- Awards for 7 Local Organization contracts were announced in April 2025
 - Draft contracts are being finalized and reviewed. Contracts will be executed before June 30
- The Statewide Organization RFP is being finalized and will be tentatively released in July 2025





DRAFT Decision-Making Framework for Legislation

Alignment

- Does the legislation directly relate to behavioral health or to the Commission and its work?
- Does the legislation relate to the implementation of the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) or the state's Behavioral Health Transformation?
- Is it aligned with the <u>strategic plan</u> of the Commission to:
- 1. Champion vision into action (elevate diverse voices, improve systems, apply global best practices);
- 2. Catalyze best practices (build capacity, strengthen workforce, ensure equitable access);
- 3. Inspire innovation (promote adaptive policy, fund new ideas, share impact stories); or
- 4. Drive expectations (reduce stigma, measure outcomes, raise public and policymaker awareness)?

Impact & Equity

- Does the legislation advance equity for marginalized or underserved groups?
- What is the potential impact (high, medium, low)?
 - What is the urgency or timing of the legislation?
- Is funding identified and sufficient to implement and sustain the legislation?

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Are the intended impacts consistent with the Commission's vision for all Californians to experience wellbeing through a coordinated, prevention and recovery focused system?

Landscape & Value

- Do stakeholders support the legislation?
- Do the individuals, communities, or organizations directly impacted by the legislation support it?
- Is the Commission's support meaningful or necessary for the legislation's success?
- Does this duplicate current legislation or other statutory mandates?

Potential Outcomes

- Support
