Maintain and Strengthen our Suicide Prevention Infrastructure

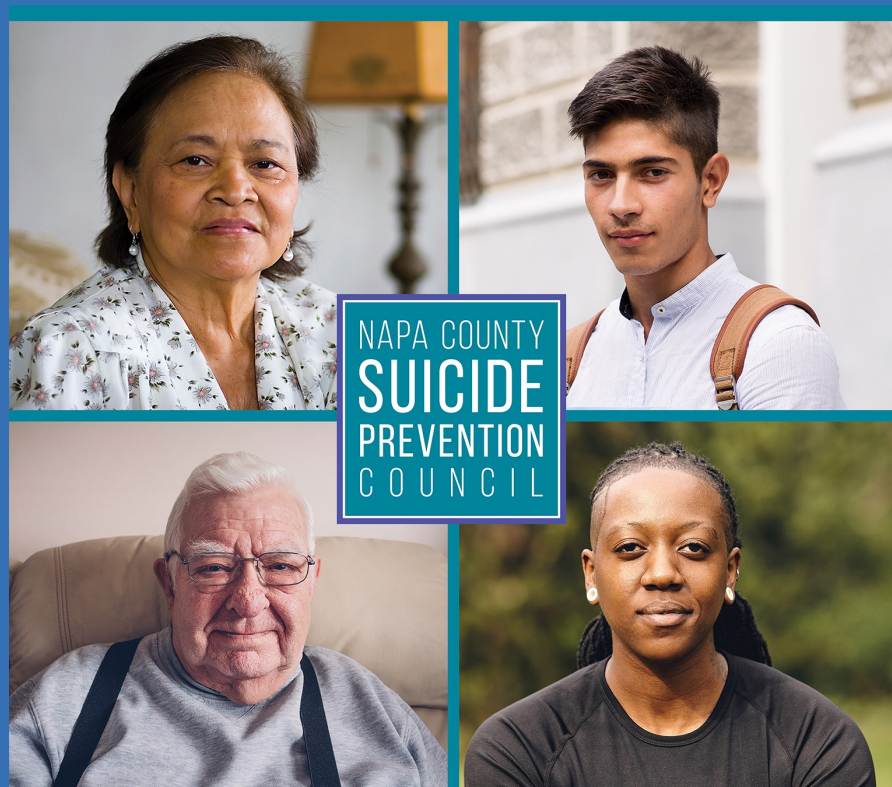
Napa County

The Napa County Suicide Prevention Council includes members from diverse private and public sectors of our community including County and City elected officials, community-based organizations, law enforcement, educators, veterans, faith leaders, survivors of suicide loss and individuals with lived experience. Over the past year, we have built council capacity and engaged councilmembers in workgroups to raise community awareness, break stigma, offer trainings and support, and understand local and national statistics around suicide.

Our workgroups include Marketing + Stigma Reduction, Survivors of Suicide Loss, QPR Suicide Prevention, Data Assessment and Evaluation, and Means Safety, which are reflected in the 3-year Strategic Plan for Suicide Prevention that we finalized at the end of 2023, with an implementation plan launching early this year.

Building council capacity was a necessary, comprehensive approach so that we can effectively move towards our vision of zero suicides in Napa County.
